Jacob Lang from Greenwood was second with a 71.

Greenwood won the team title at 298 with McCracken County claiming second with 309. Daviess County was third (313).

## Ray captures Kentucky Match Play title

OWENSBORO - For the second straight year and third time in the past four years, Scott Ray has won the Kentucky Senior Match Play Championship. The event wrapped up on Wednesday (July 21) at The Country Club of Owensboro.

Ray, a lifelong member of the Central City Country Club, and David Horning faced off in a match

with several ebbs and flows, which included Ray being 2 UP thru 13 holes. Horning then won two of the next three holes and sunk a clutch ten-foot par putt on the 18th to force extra holes. The two then played the par-five 10th which Ray reached in two, and a two-putt for birdie proved to be the latest winning moment for the Muhlenberg County

Athletic Hall of Famer.

"Yesterday, I only missed two fairways in the two matches I played," Ray summarized. "Today, I only hit four good drives and hit a bunch of toe-hooks out to the left. I've been battling the hooks for about a month now and it felt like I figured something out on the 16th hole. But then they came right back and got me on the 18th, but I hit my best shot of the day with my tee shot on the 19th."

"David and I didn't play our best today which might just be a product of being tight in the finals, but we had a great match, he played super-fast, and it was fun to go up against him. These Match Play victories mean a lot to me though because it's so different than what you usually get in stroke play. I made a double bogey on the 11th today and lost that hole, but it meant nothing by the time I was on the 12th. It's just such a fun format to play and I'm honored to win it for a second consecutive year."

## Stallions withdrawl from OVL playoffs

GREENVILLE - The Ohio Valley League announced last week that the Muhlenberg County Stallions have withdrawn from the postseason championship tournament. The league further indicated that, while regrettable following Muhlenberg's competitive season, the team made an honorable and correct decision ahead of the playoffs.

The Stallions were forced to make this decision due to player departures over the last three weeks. Multiple players have left due to injury, recalls to their schools for some activity, or other personal reasons. The combination of these departures in such a short time created an untenable situation, especially on the remaining pitchers.

The team would have been able to play their game Thursday but would have risked injury due to severe overuse of the remaining pitchers in a weekend series.

In addition, MC would not have had pitchers available next week if they won the first series. Since the Stallions' pitchers were already near their use limits, it would not have been a good representation of baseball or the League to try to play on.

Muhlenberg County forfeited the Play-in game against the Madisonville Miners. As a result, the Miners advanced to the first round to play the Henderson Flash.

The Stallions finished the season with a solid 21-22 mark and finished just five games out of the top spot in the OVL North Division.

## Embry paces Mustangs' golf at Daviess County

OWENSBORO - The 2021 KHSAA boys golf season got underway in stirring fashion on Friday afternoon.

Heath Embry carded a 93 to lead Muhlenberg County at the Daviess County Invitational golf tournament held Friday (July 30) at Ben Hawes Golf Course.

The Mustangs finished with a team score of 477. Rounding out the MC scoring were Dawson Hambrick (121), Wes Jarvis (123) and Cameron Hambrick (140).

Host Daviess County (312) won the event by 10-strokes over runner-up Ohio County. Madisonville-North Hopkins' Jackson Hill beat Owensboro Catholic's Jakob Wellman in a one-hole playoff for the individual title. Both seniors finished at 1-under par 70, before Hill birdied the first playoff hole (No. 1) to break the tie.

## Stallions claim victory over Dubois County

GREENVILLE - Muhlenberg County defeated Dubois County 8-4 on Tuesday (July 27) in what would be their final game of the 2021 Ohio Valley League baseball season at the West Campus.

The Stallions got the scoring started in the second inning with Eric Hartless two-RBI single. In the top of the fourth inning, DC tied things up on Chase Taylor's RBI single.

MC took the lead for good with three runs in the bottom of the fifth. Andy Baker and Eli Burkhart each had RBI doubles in the frame and Kevin Sosa smacked an RBI single to center.

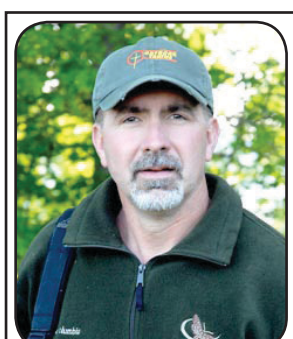
The Bombers scored

two runs in the top of the seventh to pull within one, 5-4, but Muhlenberg County answered with two of their own on Nick Lucido's two-run single.

Baker finished the game 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI and a run. Bentley Boekhout was 2-for-4 with a run, while Burkhart went 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and two runs.

Sosa was 2-for-3 with two RBIs and Eric Hartless and Lucido logged two RBIs each.



### Outdoor Truths by Gary Miller

I have to admit I can't stand going too long without checking my trial cameras. This is true especially this time of year. Even though the experts tell me to leave them alone until hunting season, I know I'm probably not even going to hunt some of these spots until the November rut anyway. So, I check away. I figure any buck that has gotten spooked by my presence now, will undoubtedly be dumbstruck early in the rut by a hot doe, forgetting all traces of human activity that I left in August.

So, I'll wait a few weeks and make my way back to the camera to see if there are any surprises that might cause me to set up a stand early. This is especially helpful for me on my Kentucky property since only one

buck is allowed for the whole year. I have two good eight pointers showing up right now but I'm not about to waste my only tag on one of these.

They need one and maybe even two more years before they become a Kentucky trophy.

For now, I will keep waiting and watching to see if a bigger deer shows up consistently or to see if I'll just need to take my chances that a stray happens to make a visit during November or December.

There have been several years when the tag I bought in September was still in my pocket in January - when the season ended. For some it was considered wasted. For me, it was not. That tag didn't represent a deer but an opportunity for a deer. That's all a hunting license is. It's an opportunity to hunt within certain parameters.

If I stay within those guidelines, I can harvest anything I want.

But there are also other parameters that are self-imposed. We each have them. They involve anything from the size of deer to the time of year. For instance, I won't shoot a doe if it has a fawn with it, or I'm not going to shoot

a doe if it's too late in the afternoon. I'm just not interested in being out at 10:00 processing deer. I prefer to be home and even in bed by then.

I find this a great picture of the Christian life and how we are meant to interact with each other. There are some things that are parameters for everyone and then there are some self-imposed convictions that others may not hold.

These self-imposed ones are the grey areas where we sometimes disagree. Paul, the writer of most of the New Testament, dealt with how we are to live with fellow Christians who may not see things the same way we do. His overall admonition is to make every effort to live in harmony with each other. (Romans 14) And there is no doubt these words still ring true.

In a world where there is so much disunity, Christians must strive to be the answer to Jesus' last prayer. "May they experience such perfect unity that the world will know you sent me and that you love them as much as you love me." (John 17:23 NLT)

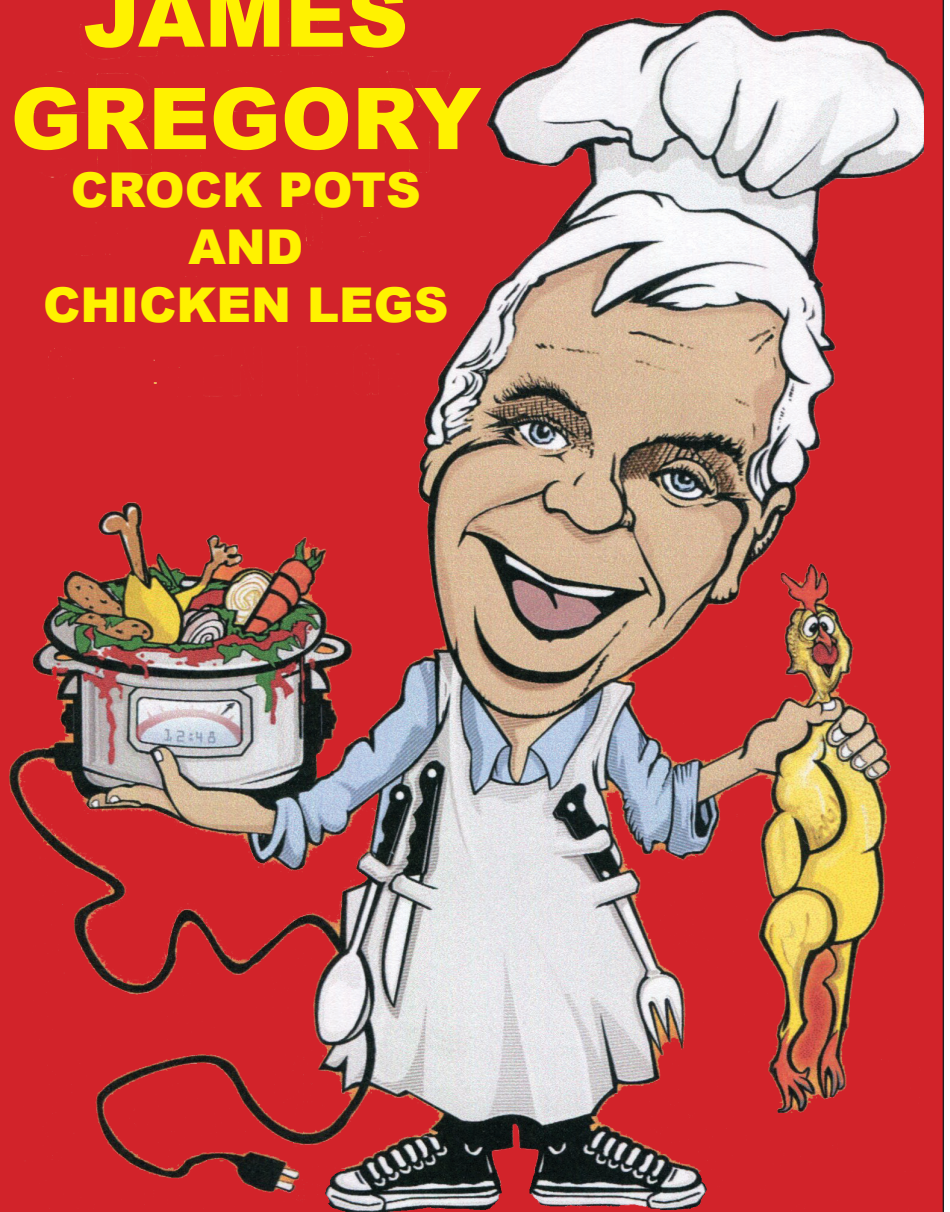

### THE SUPERVISORS OF MUHLENBERG COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2020 - JUNE 30, 2021

Conservation districts are a valuable resource to landowners who face the challenges posed by natural resource use & management. The Muhlenberg County Conservation District was organized on July 16, 1946. The district is a subdivision of state government, and is governed by a 7-member board of supervisors. The mission of the conservation district is to provide leadership in conservation, and to administer programs to help land users conserve; improve; and sustain natural resources and the environment.

The District relies on partnerships with many organizations and agencies to accomplish its goals. These organizations/agencies include the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), the Farm Service Agency (FSA), the Muhlenberg County University of Kentucky Extension Service, the Kentucky Division of Conservation, the Pennyrile Resource Conservation and Development Council (RC&D), the Muhlenberg County Fiscal Court, City of Greenville and City of Central City.

- Priorities for the District include:**
- Working with watershed conservancy districts to promote maintenance of structures and channels.
  - Sponsorship of students to attend 4H Camp, Forestry Camp and Conservation Camp.
  - Sponsorship of Muhlenberg County High School Soil Judging Team.
  - Annual Take a Kid Fishing Event 2nd Saturday in June.
  - Annual Art & Writing Contest every fall.
  - Annual Tree Day in April - 1000 free tree seedlings given away.
  - Sponsorship of the KACD Auxiliary Scholarship Program.
  - Farm Bill Legislation - Programs such as Cropland Reserve Program (CRP), Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP), State Cost Share (SCS), Agriculture Water Quality Program (AWQ) and conservation planning.
  - Other items as detailed in the District's Annual Plan of Work.

During the 2021 fiscal year, Muhlenberg County NRCS office accepted 31 new applications for the Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP). 14 of these applications were approved. Muhlenberg County received \$165,276 for the approved practices. The contracts include practices for seasonal high tunnels, cover crop, pasture renovation, and conservation cover.



**Soil Testing Voucher Program.**  
 During the 2020 calendar year, the Muhlenberg County Conservation District paid for 268 soil tests for landowners. Landowners can receive up to 40 soil testing vouchers per calendar year.

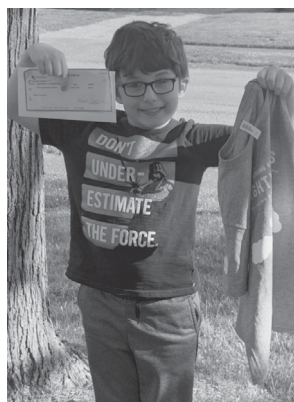


### Fluorescent Bulb Recycling Program



In 2020, the District partnered with the Muhlenberg County Fiscal Court to provide Muhlenberg County residents a drop off location for recycling fluorescent bulbs. County residents can drop off bulbs at the solid waste dump site on Dean Road in Greenville. Recycling equipment and services were provided for this program through the Environmental Grant Program with Kentucky Division of Conservation.

Due to COVID-19, many of the Conservation District's activities were cancelled in the spring. We were unable to hold our annual awards banquet in March. However, our local elementary schools continued their participation in the Annual Jim Claypool Conservation Art Contest. The following students received awards for their participation.

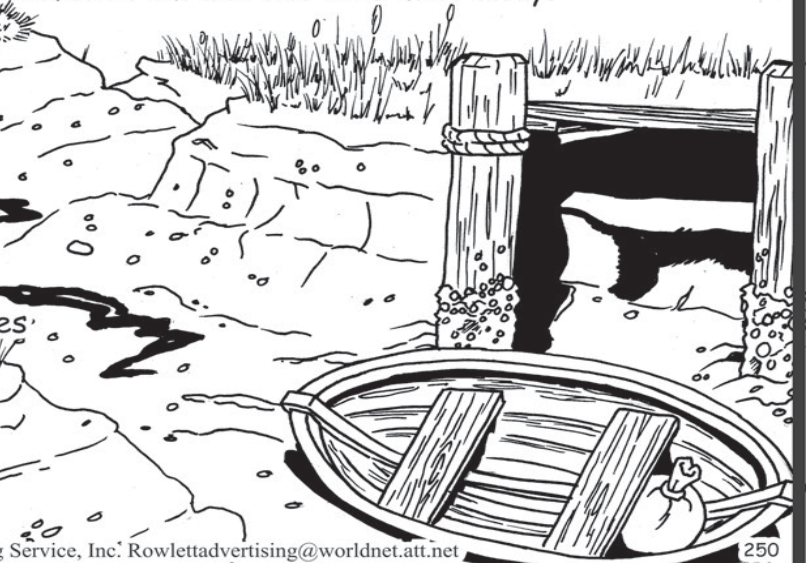
**Nahum Relates the Characteristics of God**  
Nahum Chapter 1

Nahum's prophecy is to Judah about Nineveh. It is an oracle that he received in a vision. He says that the Lord is angry with Nineveh for the way people have treated others. About God he testifies that the LORD is a jealous and avenging God; and He takes vengeance and is filled with wrath. He takes vengeance on his foes and maintains his wrath against his enemies. Next he says that the LORD is slow to anger and great in power and He will not leave the guilty unpunished. He explains that God's way is in the whirlwind and the storm, and clouds are the dust of his feet.

Continuing in his message about God, Nahum says that God rebukes the sea and dries it up; he makes all the rivers run dry. Bashan and Carmel wither and the blossoms of Lebanon fade. He says that the mountains quake before Him and the hills melt away. The earth trembles at His presence even all who live in the world.

The questions are asked: Who can withstand His indignation? Who can endure His fierce anger? Then he states that God's wrath is poured out like fire and the rocks are shattered before him.

There follows a change as Nahum relates the characteristics of God when he says that the LORD is good, a refuge in times of trouble and He cares for those who trust in him.



## Son doesn't like Mom dating

Q: I'm a divorced single mom trying to find another relationship and develop a social life. But my young son doesn't like to "share" me with anyone else. He disliked my last boyfriend so much that I was forced to end the relationship. What can I do?

Jim: Re-entering the dating arena can be a real challenge for single parents. We usually recommend that they don't involve children in the process until the relationship is well established and the couple is seriously considering marriage. Otherwise, the child may get accustomed to his parent's dating partner and begin to form an attachment -- and then the relationship ends, resulting

in yet another experience of significant loss in the child's life.

I'd suggest that the next time you become involved in a romantic relationship, don't push your son to get to know your boyfriend until the two of you are sure that you're moving toward engagement and marriage. At that point, have a heart-to-heart talk with your boy. Assure him of your love and commitment to him, and that you realize no one could ever replace his dad. Explain that you don't expect your boyfriend to be his father, but that because you love this man very much, you want him to have a place in the family.

So, take it slow and gradually introduce your

child to the new relationship. Don't expect instant bonding, and don't pressure your son and your boyfriend to become instant buddies. You might start by including your boyfriend in some activities that your son enjoys.

Above all, carefully consider whether the man you're dating has what it takes to become a positive influence in your child's life. Your primary responsibility is your son -- so it's critical that you determine whether your romantic interest has the depth of character to become a good stepparent.

Q: We've always tried to encourage our kids to set goals and work toward them. But these past 18 months -- our whole fam-

ily just feels stuck. Do have any suggestions that can help us get unstuck?

Dr. Danny Huerta, Vice President, Parenting & Youth: Every living thing in the universe (including your family) is moving in some way and has momentum. The question is whether your family's momentum is positive or negative.

Positive momentum builds relational stability and health, while negative momentum moves toward dysfunction and dissatisfaction. A family's negative momentum can be tough to change, especially when working against unhealthy patterns and habits. But here's the good news: Every day is a new opportunity to move toward the positive.

Think of your situation. Are you overwhelmed and exhausted? Have you surrendered on some important boundaries for your children? Have certain circumstances intensified momentum in the wrong direction? Consider these ideas for shifting momentum in your home:

Look in the mirror. It's easy to blame others and circumstances for our difficulties, but we can change this by redirecting our own thoughts and actions.

If you're married, love your spouse. The relationship between a husband and wife is foundational to the home. When that relationship is going well, it is more likely that parents will have the mental and emotional energy to

love and guide their children.

Smile. Even if things aren't going well, smiling can help loosen up your mind toward possibilities rather than getting stuck on limitations. Experiment with the ripple effect of a genuine smile on your family.

Make time to talk. Conversation that is loving, warm and understanding can create positive momentum, regardless of your circumstances. Use life-giving words that bring truth, encouragement and, when needed, loving correction.

Carve out time together. Play board games, exercise together, take walks or cook as a family. The key is doing things together.



**DAVE SAYS**  
Money Advice

Dear Dave,  
My fiancée and I want to make an offer on a house. She has a lot of late payments and a bad credit record, though, but she is working hard to manage her money better and get out of debt. I don't make enough mon-

ey to get a home loan by myself, and I have some debt to pay off, too. In order to help us out, my aunt and uncle said they are willing to co-sign a mortgage loan for us. What do you think of that idea?

Dear Evan,  
Here's a simple, solid piece of advice for anyone looking to make a purchase of any kind. If you need a co-signer, you're not ready to make that purchase—period. I'm not trying to beat you up or anything, but it's way too soon for you two to be thinking about buying a home. I mean, for starters you're just engaged right now. When a lender requires

a co-signer, it basically means they don't believe you'll pay back the money. And besides, you two don't need a house now *or* right after you get married. The two of you should get married, and live in a decent, inexpensive apartment for a while. During that time, you both need to work hard on paying off all your debt. After that, save up an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses. Then, start setting aside cash for a down payment on a modest home.

When it comes time to buy a home, I recommend a 15-year, fixed rate loan with a down payment of at least 10%.

Twenty percent is better, because it will help you avoid having to pay PMI (private mortgage insurance). Make sure the monthly payments on the loan are no more than 25% of your combined take home pay. Keeping the payments at 25% or below will make it easier to address other important financial issues, like saving and investing.

Your aunt and uncle are obviously generous people, Evan, but they're a little misguided in their offer. At this point, helping you two buy a house—something you obviously can't afford—would be a huge burden instead of a blessing.

Note: this size batch is what my mom always used for our large family, however, it may be cut in half or divided to fit your size ice cream freezer. Also "Schlick" is a Pennsylvania Dutch word for "quick" or "easy."

### QUICK AND SCHLICK ICE CREAM

¾ cup brown sugar  
¾ cup instant Clear Jel  
½ teaspoon salt  
2 to 3 cups heavy cream  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract  
1 quart frozen, chopped strawberries (optional)  
whole milk

#### Instructions

Stir the sugars, Clear Jel, and salt in a large mixing bowl. Add the cream, and stir vigorously. Add vanilla, strawberries, and mix well. Pour into a six quart freezer. Add whole milk to ice cream mixture until freezer is four inches full. Freeze until thickened and soft frozen.
